## Protocols for Arriving Passengers Effective 30 May 2022

Effective 30 May 2022, the following entry, testing and quarantine protocols for international arriving Filipinos shall be observed, per IATF Resolution No. 168, Series of 2022:

- Unvaccinated Filipino minors between 12-17 years shall follow the classification and procedures based on their status (i.e. their vaccination status). In such case, parents shall accompany such children during their facility-based quarantine.
- Unvaccinated minor Filipino nationals below 12 years shall follow the protocols of their parents/ accompanying guardians

### Fully-Recovered Filipino Nationals with Positive Pre-Departure Results

Positive RT-PCR test result taken within 48 hours or a rapid antigen negative result taken within 24 hours from departure

May enter the Philippines, but must present prior to departing country of origin and upon arrival in the Philippines:

- Positive RT-PCT test taken not earlier than 10 days but not later than 30 days prior to departure from country of origin
- Positive RT-PCR test taken within 48 hours prior to departure from country of origin
- Medical certificate stating Filipino was (a) asymptomatic, mild, moderate, severe or critical case of Covid-19; b) has completed mandatory isolation period; c) is no lonfer infectious; d) has been allowed free movement and travel

No mandatory facility-based quarantine but self-monitor for seven (7) days
